#### 2. Declarations of interest 41/22

#### 3.To approve the minutes of previous meeting 42/22

- The council approved the minutes of the ordinary meeting of the 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022.

#### 4.To approve the list of payments 43/22

- The council agreed the list of payments and explanations provided where appropriate.

#### 5.To receive a report from the VOGC representative Councillor Penrose 44/22

- The councillor gave updates regarding a number of ongoing issues that he was aware of. He updated the meeting in relation to the installation of the new footpath at the rear of the school. It should be completed fairly soon having been provided with money from the active travel fund from the VOGC. They are awaiting position to extend the footpath, but this appears to be subject to funding.
- The VOGC had received a number of complaints regarding potholes on the major routes around the village. They had been subject to a full inspection today (15/3/22) and those in excess of 30mm deep were to be repaired immediately with the remainder to be repaired at a later date.

#### 6.To Receive updates from Councillors regarding a survey conducted at Cosmeston 45/22

- Councillor Lynn updated the meeting regarding the Cosmeston Survey. He gave an overview of the uptake and the suggestions to improve the area submitted by its residents. There appeared to be an appetite for celebrations in respect of the platinum jubilee celebrations along with long term aspirations of children's play areas and re wilding. The community council agreed to the distribution of the results on the council's website and social media **and to explore the feasibility of the various proposals.**

**7.To discuss the renewal of planning for allotments at Hayes Road and to resolve upon any further actions required 46/22**

- The community council had received an extension in respect of the planning application that had been previously submitted for allotments at the old civic amenities site at Hayes Road. There was discussion surrounding the next steps especially around funding. It was obvious that there were some initial expenditure that would be required. It was decided that the matter would need to be remitted in the first instance to the finance committee for further discussions.

**8.To discuss the provision of a place plan for Sully and to resolve upon any further actions required 47/22**

- The community Council agreed to pay the remainder of the previously agreed £1200 to the Our Future Communities group. Any further funding would have to be agreed by the community council.

**9.To discuss and resolve upon any planned events for the Queens platinum jubilee including the provision of a beacon 48/22**

- There were discussions, of a general nature, of various activities that are/may take place. Councillors are still awaiting costings for a beacon. A number of other options were being considered, a Hog Roast had been priced and it was obvious that a number of street parties were being considered by residents

**10. To discuss and resolve upon the provision of a defibrillator at Cog Road 49/22**

- Councillor Bowring (KB) had made some enquiries in relation to this matter and had been in touch with the contractors Taylor Wimpey at Cog Road. There was much discussion regarding this and there are further enquiries that need to be made by the councillor.

**11.Receive reports from representatives on external bodies 50/22**

- Councillors gave either verbal or written reports, where appropriate, regarding Sully School, Evenlode School, Chemical Advisory Board and the Community Liaison Panel

**12.Democratic Half Hour 51/22**

- The public were invited to ask questions regarding any items that were on the agenda or otherwise
- Only one comment from the public regarding the upcoming Jubilee celebrations and the importance of some sort of community event even if it was only a picnic on the community fields.

**13.Any Other Business 52/22**

- There was nothing discussed that needs to be included in a further agenda
