Audit opinion - Qualified

Except for the matters reported below in my Basis for Qualification, on the basis of my review, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention giving cause for concern that in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use
 of resources.

Basis for Qualification

Accounting Statement

The Council's annual return contains misstatements that will require restating in the next annual return. They are as follows:

- Staff costs are overstated by £1384.88 due to payroll services, insurance and lease costs being included within staff
 costs and therefore total other payments are understated by an equal amount.
- As raised by the Council's internal auditor, the reported asset figure for 2020/21 is inconsistent with the Council's asset register and was overstated. The Council should have clearly stated the restatement figure and disclosed in accordance with the Practioners guidance.

Annual Governance Statement

In my opinion, the Annual Governance Statement is inconsistent with the Council's governance arrangements for the year

- Assertion 1 maintaining adequate accounting records. The Council has not kept adequate accounting records or was
 unable to provide the records at the time of the audit. The Council had not kept adequate invoices for expenditure paid
 within the year and did not keep a separate record of receipts for all income received.
- Assertion 3 noncompliance with laws, regulations and codes of practice. The Council has not provided evidence that a budget has been set in accordance with the Local Government Finance Act (1992) and that the precept has been set in line with the budget. The Act requires the Council to take into account its level of reserves when setting its budget requirement. We recommend that the Council sets a budget in accordance with the relevant regulations and codes of practice.

Other matters arising and recommendations

I draw the Council's attention to the following matters and recommendations which do not affect my audit opinion but should be addressed by the body.

Insurance

We have not been able to gain assurance on if the Council has sufficient insurance coverage regarding Fidelity Guarantee insurance. We recommend that the Council reviews its insurance arrangements and ensure it has adequate insurance covering all major assets, employer's liability, public liability and fidelity guarantee insurance.
